Artwork on the theme of contrasting cultural elements

Culture is a complex and multifaceted concept that encompasses the collective knowledge, beliefs, customs, traditions, arts, and social practices of a particular group or society. It includes language, religion, food, music, literature, fashion, rituals, and other expressions of human creativity. Culture influences individuals' behavior, values, and worldview, shaping their identities and providing a framework for social interaction. It is transmitted from one generation to the next through socialization and plays a vital role in shaping societies, fostering cohesion, providing a sense of belonging and shared heritage. The culture of Gilgit-Baltistan, a region in northern Pakistan, is distinct and differs from the culture of other provinces in several aspects. Through this artwork, fine arts department student Faisal Khan has attempted to show the contrasting elements between the culture of Gilgit Baltistan and Punjab. He has used the medium of photography and collage to capture the differences of traditional and cultural elements, and the technique of weaving to create a sense of similarity in these two distinctive cultures.











Eid Milad un-Nabi (S.A.W) is the day commemorating the birth of the Holy Prophet Muhammad (P.B.U.H). It is marked on the 12th of Rabi'-Ul-Awaal, the third month according to the Islamic lunar calendar.
